A note about our guest speakers:

Melissa M. Statham, MD will speak on nasal and sinus problems that are experienced by children with CF. Dr. Statham is Assistant Professor of Pediatrics at Emory University. Following her residency training in Otolaryngology – Head and Neck Surgery at the University of Cincinnati, she obtained fellowship training in Laryngology & Care of Professional Voice at the University of Pittsburgh and then returned to Cincinnati for additional fellowship training in Pediatric Otolaryngology at Cincinnati Children’s Hospital. Dr. Statham came to Atlanta in the summer of 2010 as a pediatric otolaryngologist at the Emory Children’s Clinic, where she cares for many of our CF patients.

Scott Powers, PhD will speak on techniques that parents can use to help children with CF to eat better and meet their nutritional goals. Dr. Powers is a Professor of Pediatrics and Psychology at the University of Cincinnati, and Director of Clinical and Translational Research and Director of the Center for Child Behavior and Nutrition Research and Training at Cincinnati Children’s Hospital Medical Center. He is a pediatric clinical psychologist who has distinguished himself as an accomplished researcher into ways to influence and improve parenting and child behaviors around eating. He specifically has a long-term interest in behavioral approaches to improving nutritional intake and weight gain in young children with CF, and he will share his insights with us.
